

10 CONSERVATION DISTRICTS WAYS CAN HELP YOU:



1 - They offer **Cost-Share Programs** that cover a portion of the cost for landowners to install eligible projects that improve natural resource management and sustainability.



2 - They understand **Livestock and Nutrient Management**, and may be able to help you plan, fund, and implement projects such as manure storage facilities, livestock feeding areas, fencing, and more.

3 - They can answer questions about federal **Farm Bill Programs**, and see if you have potential practices that qualify for financial assistance.



4 - They can help with **Water Conservation**—many districts offer irrigation water management, and some offer financial incentives for upgrading to more efficient irrigation systems.



5 - They can help you promote **Forest Health**. Services include forest planning and free on-site assessments to help you reduce wildfire risk.



6 - They assist with **Water Resource Management** on properties that border water, including streambank restoration and plantings that protect water quality and reduce erosion.



7 - They can help **Preserve Farmland** by connecting you to resources for estate planning, agricultural easements, and market opportunities.



8 - They offer **Soil Health** services, including soil testing, recommendations for erosion control, and some districts offer low-cost rentals of no-till drills.



9 - They may be able to help **Save Energy** on your farm by assessing opportunities to improve efficiency and offering assistance with equipment upgrades.



10 - They offer help with **Noxious Weed Management**, and many districts host annual native plant sales.
